175 Years "THEN AND NOW"

When we celebrated the 100th birthday of our beautiful and historic sanctuary building in 1912, members heard "Voices from the Past." At the beginning of each worship service, voices of many imminent church members who began and continued our great history. There were and are many voices of other faithful and devoted members: those who rang the church bell to call people to worship, members who came regularly to seek direction for their lives, and the ushers who welcomed them. Other voices includes music directors who led faithful choir members to sing of God's glory week after organists, pianists, instrumentalists accompanied soloists and the various choirs, those who helped with the sound system and broadcasts of the services, our 34 pastors and interim ministers who proclaimed God's word and strengthened our faith, guest ministers who led winter bible studies and annual revivals, staff members and volunteers who assisted them in their work. There are unheard voices of the devout women who enrolled babies in the Cradle Doll, nursery workers, primary leaders who taught children of God's love, members who led Sunbeams, Girls auxiliary (GAs), Royal Ambassadors (RAs), Scouts, Baptist Young People's Union (BYPU), Baptist Training Union (BTU) for all ages. There are voices of Committed Sunday School teachers who loved, nurtured, and influenced the growth of children and youth into

These "Voices: have worked in a cooperative spirit, built our 175 years of history, continue to listen for God's voice, and pray for our future.
