175 Years "THEN AND NOW"

Due to effects of Hurricane Florence, followed by Hurricane Michael, it was necessary to rearrange three of the four Sundays commemorating our 175th celebrations. The day to recognize and honor Dr. Phillips 20 years of ministry at First Baptist Church was moved to Sunday, October 14, 2018.

Following an inspiring sermon by Dr. Phillips, Tommy Gibson presented a portrait of Dr. Phillips, done by his son, Ben Gibson, with a border to be signed by those present and then placed around the portrait prior to its framing.

Glenn's wife Allyson; their son Josh, his wife Renee and their young son Landon; son Rob, his wife Nickie and their baby daughter Lottie; brother Jerry, and wife Donna; and Glenn Phillips, Sr. were present for the occasion. A spoken memory of Glenn's deceased mother Gladys was made.

Fall decorations in the corridors to the Elsie Hooks Fellowship Hall and those on the tables set a festive atmosphere for the lunch that followed the service. After the lunch, Dr. Phillips made remarks, he thanked the Decorations, Christian Fellowship, and Hospitality Committees for their services, and for cooking and serving the meal.

Dave Parsons, Finance Chairman, presented a monetary gift to Dr. Phillips and a gift to Allyson. Rev. Scott Thrailkill paid a personal tribute to Dr. Phillips, after which he invited all those who wished to share personal comments and tributes. The Church Historian, Lola Delbridge, recognized Dr. Phillips 20 years of ministry by using 20 words that rhymed with Glenn and characterized his personality and ministry. She announced that prayers for his future were unlimited, but she named 20 specific prayers for him.

Dr. Glenn Phillips received a standing ovation with a loud applause. Happy fellowship among those present concluded Dr. Glenn Phillips, Jr. Day!

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

NEW ADDITION TO THE SANCTUARY BELLS

On Sunday you will notice two unusual-looking sets of long silver and black metal rectangles being used by the Sanctuary Bells. These are octaves six and seven of Malmark Choirchimes. You will enjoy the deep, rich sound of these instruments. These were purchased thanks to a generous donation to the music ministry from the Estate of Ella (Bowen) Lomastro of Chicago, Illinois, who passed away November 13, 2017.

Born at home on a farm December 30, 1922, in Wilson, Mrs. Lomastro was one of the nine children of Henry F. Bowen and Emma Coley Bowen, share-croppers. At the age of 19, she went to work at the base in Goldsboro. She soon jumped at the opportunity to move to Chicago with help from a friend. Without telling her parents, she packed all her things, neglected to phone her parents (they had no phone), and got on a train bound for Chicago. She took up residence at the YWCA and finally called home to tell her parents what she'd done. Her father's only response: "You had to pick the meanest city on earth!"

Her first job in Chicago was in accounting, where she befriended a young woman who took her home with her one weekend and introduced her to her older brother, Richard Lomastro, the President of Master Electric of Chicago. They were married within the year. She eventually became the co-founder and CFO of Visual Marketing, Inc., of Chicago, which today averages \$20 million in sales annually, but she didn't forget her North Carolina roots.

Thank you, Mrs. Lomastro for your generous donation of \$10,000 to the music ministry of First Baptist Church. You will be remembered every time the Sanctuary Bells worship our risen Lord in song!


